


### ROOTED IN GOD'S WORD Growing in Faith Together

On Sunday, Jan. 5<sup>th</sup>, we will celebrate the Feast of Epiphany, a joyous occasion marking the revelation of Christ to the world and the visit of the Magi, or Three Kings, who brought gifts to honor the newborn King. This special day reminds us of God's light shining for all people and invites us to reflect on the gifts we offer in return.

Our church school children will play a wonderful part in this celebration. Dressed as Kings and perhaps a Queen, with a camel or two, they will process into church after the Peace, carrying symbolic gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. These gifts, traditionally offered to Jesus, represent His kingship, divinity, and sacrifice. At coffee hour we will have a King's cake containing a hidden tiny "baby" representing the Christ Child. It's great fun to see who will find it in their piece of King's cake. As I recall, Gavin found the "baby" in his piece of cake two or was it three years in a row!





November income was \$12,443.50 over budget by \$2,122.59. Year to date income is \$128,760.90 over budget by \$18,140.89.


November expenses were \$7,788.24 under budget by \$1,412.66. Year to date expenses are \$119,952.17 over budget by \$7,022.27.

# Let's Name Our Church Bell



The practice of naming church bells dates back to at least the 10<sup>th</sup> century, when Pope John XIII dedicated a bell to St. John the Baptist. The tradition of naming bells is likely due to the belief that each bell has a unique "voice".

Inscriptions: Bells are often inscribed with the name of the donor or the saint to whom the bell is dedicated. Inscriptions can also be used to memorialize the bell's origin, add decoration, or state the bell's purpose.

Blessings: Bells are blessed with a solemn ceremony that often includes anointing with oils. The ceremony is so similar to the rites of Christian initiation that some people refer to it as the "baptism of the bell".

Connections: Bells are sometimes named after specific connections. For example, the largest bell in St. John Cantius Church in Chicago is named St. Anne because it's named after the church in Krakow where St. John Cantius served and is buried.

The bell at Christ Church has never been given a name. We would like to rectify that and are proposing a contest to name our bell.




## SILENT NIGHT



For 2024, we had 34 pledges and the amount was \$86, 781. We are so pleased to announce that there are 39 pledges for 2025 - an 11.5% increase in the number and six of those are from new pledging units!!
